

Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show – "the world's largest" 50th Anniversary

July 09 Saskatoon/Regina, SK to Brooks, AB Our journey begins as our group assembles to travel to Brooks for overnight.

July 10 Spokane, WA (B)

After being joined by our Alberta friends, we are on our way. Towering mountains surround us as we travel through the picturesque Crowsnest Pass. We enter the United States traveling via Sandpoint and Coeur d'Alene en route to Spokane for overnight. This evening, stroll through **Riverfront Park**, site of Expo '74.

July 11 Bend, OR – 2 Nights (B, D)

Travelling via the Columbia River we continue south through agricultural lands. An old-fashioned main street in a quaint village nestled at the base of the Cascade Mountains — this is Sisters. This evening we include the **Quilter's Affair Event featuring a popular quilt lecturer**. We spend the next **two nights in Bend**.

July 12 Sisters/Bend, OR (B)

An exciting day is planned visiting The 50th Anniversary of the Largest Outdoor Quilt Show in the World. The 1800's era town is adorned with more than 1200 quilts hanging from every surface. Like-minded visitors stroll along the streets admiring these works of art and sharing ideas. Explore the shops including the Stitchin' Post Quilt Shop — host of the event. On return to Bend, we visit The Quilt Basket and The Mill District.

July 13 Tillamook, OR (B)

Beautiful mountain scenery and lush forests lead us to Salem where we take a break for lunch and a visit to Craft Warehouse where their quilting department is a favourite spot. We continue west to the Pacific Coast and the town of Tillamook. On arrival we visit the Latimer Quilt and Textile Center. This

1930's converted schoolhouse features a textile gallery, a research library with out-of-print patterns and books, a quilting room, a spinning and weaving room and handcrafted gifts. Often local artists can be seen at work. Our day concludes with the **Tillamook Creamery** for a self-guided tour, sampling, time for dinner and shopping.

July 14 Astoria, OR (B)

Winding highway, with spectacular coastal views, leads the way to Cannon Beach – a mecca for artisans. On arrival we visit Center Diamond Quilts and then explore the streets lined with shops, galleries and restaurants. A stop is made to "dip a toe" in the Pacific. Continuing up the coast to Astoria, our hotel is strategically located in the shadows of the spectacular Astoria – Megler Bridge.

July 15 Leavenworth, WA (B)

We travel to the beautiful alpine community of **Leavenworth** for the afternoon and evening, to explore this lovely Bavarian town featuring unique shops, eateries and the **Leavenworth Quilt Company.**

July 16 Sandpoint, ID (B, BP)

We continue east to Spokane for a stop at **The Quilting Bee**. We overnight in Sandpoint with an evening **"Block Party"**. Share special finds with new quilting friends and personal anecdotes of the tour.

July 17 Brooks, AB (B)

We travel to Canada today returning to Alberta where one more quilt shop stop is planned before we say "sew-long" to some of our group. Saskatchewan passengers overnight in Brooks.

Departure Points: You may depart from any location along the first day of travel. Please discuss your options when making your reservation.

Deposit: A non-refundable deposit of \$300 per person is required at time of booking. Your booking is **NOT** confirmed without this deposit. Should <u>you</u> need to cancel, this deposit will be retained. Travel Insurance is strongly encouraged. In the unlikely event Corben Tours needs to cancel, all deposits will be returned in full.

Forms of Payment: In an effort to reduce overhead costs for our guests, forms of payment include Cheque, Certified Cheque (payable to Corben Tours), Cash or E-transfer (cbconsult@myaccess.ca).

* In the event of the devaluation of the Canadian Dollar, all tours are subject to surcharge until 60 days prior to departure.

Final Payment: Due 60 days prior to departure. Bookings made after this date require full payment by certified cheque or e-transfer at time of booking.

Cancellation: 60 – 31 days before departure – 25% penalty; 30 – 22 days before departure – 50% penalty; 21 – 0 days before departure – 100% penalty. Cancellation penalties may vary depending on tour, and suppliers.
